Letter from Mrs Huish and Mrs Eversfield 29.4.25

Dear Families,

What a joy it has been so far this half term to bask in the glorious sunshine and to enjoy the seasonal changes. The orchard is looking spectacular at the moment and as we enter the summer term, we are reminded, once more, how quickly the school year flies by. Looking ahead to what is always a wonderful term, we have so many events and activities planned for all of the community to enjoy, from sports days and Y6 performances to EYFS Booknics and not forgetting the hotly anticipated transition days into our new classes.

At this point in the year, we begin our planning for next year and start to look at new class lists. As you can imagine, putting together classes for the next year is a lengthy process. We are often asked how we decide who goes into which class and the answer is that there is not magical formula that helps us. Class teachers sit together to discuss classes and look holistically at each child and consider elements such as friendships and individual needs. This year, we have adapted our **transition day** slightly so that our transition will be held on the **afternoon of 30th June** and will include a parent 'Meet the Teacher' session at 2:30pm. This will give both children and adults the opportunity to get to know the new class and to meet the teacher and ask any questions you may have for the year ahead.

This half term also brings the advent of the **Year 6 SATs** on the week beginning **12th May**. The children have been working incredibly hard to prepare themselves for these tests and whilst we know that the tests only look at a snapshot of the children's abilities, they do support the children in becoming 'secondary ready' so that they can fully access the secondary school curriculum. These tests are a celebration of all the children have achieved over their time in Primary and we are incredibly proud of all of the children. The two highlights of the week are always the Year 6 breakfast each day and the celebratory conga around the school on Thursday!

You may also had heard the 'buzz' about **World Bee Day**! On **Tuesday 20th May**, Mrs Eyland will be leading the way with a celebration of these incredible and vital pollinators. Children are invited to dress up; Bees, stripes, yellow and black, wings, flowers, bright colours...! There will be a selection of bee themed activities throughout the day including an assembly and a special gardening club. There will be a gardening club sale table at drop off and pickup. The festivities will culminate



with a whole school 'bee-bomb bonanza', where we will plant a new border for pollinators on the school field. We're all 'buzzing' with excitement!








Removing Barriers: Positive Behaviour Policy

This year, we have launched a new behaviour policy. Mr T, along with other SENDCOs in the Trust recognised that the previous policy did not support our Trauma Informed approach and so this year have worked to introduce a new relational approach to behaviour management. Since September, we have been working with all staff members to implement a new approach which uses a behaviour flow chart to support children, instead of the old 'C' system, whilst still maintaining the high standards that we expect of all children. Last term,



Mrs Huish and Mrs Eversfield spent time listening to the children and staff to hear their views of the policy. Children and staff told us that behaviour is good in classes with the new approach supporting children to make wise choices. In our assemblies this half term, we are exploring the question "What is Self-Regulation?" in order to support children in independently regulating their learning behaviours. Next half term, we will be running coffee mornings to share the policy in details with parents and answer any questions.
